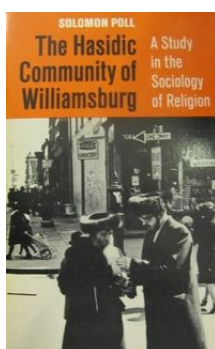


THE HASIDIC COMMUNITY OF WILLIAMSBURG: A STUDY IN THE SOCIOLOGY OF RELIGION
