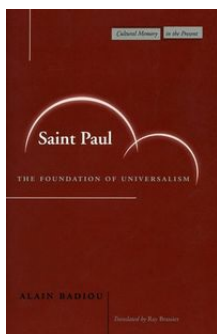


SAINT PAUL: THE FOUNDATION OF UNIVERSALISM
